

RESOLUTION ON THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES' REMEDIATION PROPOSAL
(#05-95/96-EP)

- WHEREAS, The Board of Trustees' Subcommittee on Remedial Education has recommended the elimination of remedial education programs within the CSU System by the year 2001; and
- WHEREAS, "Humboldt State University seeks to offer each person the opportunity to realize the highest aspirations of people everywhere for the good of both the individual and society" (HSU 1995-96 catalog, p.23); and
- WHEREAS, The aforementioned opportunity requires academic programs and course work which foster broad access and diversity among our student population; and
- WHEREAS, Humboldt State University placement policies are designed to monitor students' varied preparation for college work; and
- WHEREAS, Remedial courses represent a reasonable and supportable use of resources at Humboldt State University; and
- WHEREAS, The remediation proposal's 2001 timeline for the elimination of CSU remedial education programs is neither appropriate nor realistic; therefore, be it
- RESOLVED: That the Academic Senate of Humboldt State University recommends to the Board of Trustees to reject the recommendations of its Subcommittee on Remedial Education which calls for the elimination of remedial education programs within the CSU System by the year 2001.
