RESOLUTION ON COLLEGE PREPARATORY COURSE REQUIREMENTS (#11-94/95-EP)

- WHEREAS, The CSU Academic Senate has passed a resolution which supports the recommendation of the Admission Advisory Council that the Chancellor "Authorize all CSU campuses to admit the 1995-96 academic year through the 1997-98 academic year applicants completing either the CSU or the UC college preparatory course requirements while discussions within CSU and between CSU and UC are conducted."; and
- WHEREAS, The only difference between the base requirements of the UC and the CSU is a course in visual and performing arts which the UC accepts as an elective but the CSU requires; and
- WHEREAS, In the intervening three years, a study will be conducted to see how this change affects the course preparatory patterns for entering CSU students, 88% of whom now fulfill the visual and performing arts requirement; and
- WHEREAS, Not requiring a course in visual and performing arts for entrance into the CSU may, in these times of fiscal crisis, jeopardize high school programs in the visual and performing arts; and
- WHEREAS, It is important that high school students have an opportunity to be introduced to the visual and performing arts; therefore, be it
- RESOLVED: That the Academic Senate of Humboldt State University recommends that the CSU Academic Senate work to retain the entrance requirement in visual and performing arts; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the Academic Senate of Humboldt State University recommends that Humboldt State University continue its current policy of requiring the entrance requirement in visual and performing arts.
