Re: JMC 302 and TA 307 - from Jenni and CDC:

I suspect these are probably fine GEAR courses in the end, but the descriptions were changing enough, and in ways that potentially veer away from GE, further review seemed warranted. Part of the issue is that we have no syllabus or GEAR matrix so all we have to go off of is the change to the course description which raises some questions:

1. JMC 302 - they are removing key GE phrasing about analyzing personal responses, cultivating an understanding of the art, etc. which are hallmarks of C2 in my view. Now they will "examine the relationship between media and shifting social, cultural, technological trends..." - will they achieve GEAR learning outcomes by "examining" (vs. the previous 'cultivating' 'analyzing' and developing 'powers of discrimination' - which all seem very in line with GE area C)?

#### 2. TA 307 - two issues:

- a. the description appears to be narrowed to one particular framework (Augusto Boal theories)? If this were a literature course, that would generally be considered too narrow for GE (at least systemwide CSU GE review). Are the learning outcomes broad enough that students will gain an understanding of the arts/humanities useful to any educated citizen and transferable to many walks of life (in addition to those of theatre professionals)?
- b. Performance/studio/activity are generally excluded from GE, unless the course contributes to a broader contextual understanding of the arts & humanities. The description seems even more performance-heavy, is it \*too\* much for GE or still ok?

### JMC 125 Notes

#### Mark's notes on JMC 125 assessment:

Part II of the GEAR form covers assessment via tables 2 and 3. Here are my notes and recommendations on those tables.

#### Table 2

(a)

JMC has filled out table 2 and also included their own table. The outcomes referenced in JMC's table are from the CO's EO on GE. These are relevant, to be sure, as, to be certified for Area A, courses need to demonstrate that the curriculum addresses this set of skills and knowledge. (Appendix A of the GEAR form paraphrases these outcomes; these paraphrases were linked in the box for prompt 4 of table 1.)

Unfortunately, it is nearly impossible to establish the kind of program-level learning assessment that our accreditor requires of us if we use the EO as our assessment structure. This is because the EO features roughly 40 outcomes. The university senate approved 14 GEAR PLOs a couple years ago in order to shrink the assessment challenge to a (hopefully) manageable number. The alignment of the JMC course curriculum to the EO Area A outcomes is terrific, but we need a simplified approach for institutional assessment.

Thus, JMC should state in table 2 that the course will assess GEAR PLO3: *Critically evaluate issues, ideas, artifacts, and evidence.* (This is requested in prompt 1 of the directions for table 2 in the GEAR form.)

(b)

The SLO in table 2 seems oriented to the signature assignment, which is terrific. Good start.

The SLO, however, should be written like an outcome. Consider this PLO/SLO matchup that was included as an example on the form.

**GEAR PLO**: Develop and express ideas effectively in writing.

SLO (In order to achieve this GEAR PLO, students will perform the

following demonstration of specific measurable behaviors):

Students will write a reflective text in which they analyze and

provide evidence of their abilities to address audience, context, genre, and

discourse.

Notice how the above example SLO identifies the specific behaviors faculty wish to see from students. Reading it, one can infer that the rubric for the signature assignment will probably score analysis and evidence for four criteria: audience, context, genre, and discourse.

To achieve the same simplicity and clarity, JMC should revise their SLO to resemble the above example.

Given the description of the signature assignment in table 3, perhaps the SLO would read something like this:

Using digital tools to track their media consumption, students will identify assertions and analyze them for supporting evidence.

Bear in mind that that's an example written by an outsider, so it could certainly be way off the mark. But please note how the example attempts to shrink the signature assignment to specific measurable elements that can be used to assess student critical thinking. JMC is free to grade student submissions as faculty see fit. The purpose here is to identify a manageable set of criteria that can be scored for university-wide assessment. Less is more for assessment, while actual grading can be as complex and nuanced as faculty wish it to be.

#### Table 3

The description of the signature assignment is perfectly acceptable.

The assessment tool should score evidence of achieving the GEAR PLO. I recommend some revisions here so that the tool identifies criteria specifically aligned to the goal of measuring how well students have learned to critically evaluate issues, ideas, artifacts, and evidence (GEAR PLO3). It seems obvious that the signature assignment requires this—the only task is to identify what specifics will be scored.

Again, JMC faculty are free to **grade** student submissions however they see fit. The GEAR committee just needs to see what specific criteria aligned to the PLO will be **scored**. If the example SLO that I offered above were used, for instance, the tool would be pretty simple, focusing on identification of assertions and analysis of supporting evidence.
