We at the Womxn's Resource Center focus on building and creating outlets in which we make connections and provide resources for the student body. Such events include Take Back the Night, Hxrstory Month, Kink on Campus, Mxnstrual Gear Project and many more collaborations with other centers on campus. Our small office space limits our duties as a resource center and we are in need of storage space to continue to foster relationships with students of all identities across campus. To create an office space that feels comfortable we would like to see less clutter build up in our small office space which is why we would love to have an extra storage space.

Goal 3 Details:

As mentioned in the above goal we collaborate with many on and off campus communities, such as Human Health & Services, Black Humboldt, LCAE, Check it, Humboldt Domestic Violence Services and many many more. We value and learn a lot from these communities and we believe that we will be able to function more properly if storage was available.

Goal 4 Details:

The University's financial resources involving sustainability align with the Womxn's Resources focus towards sustainability in respects of sustaining and maintaining student-WRC relationships transparent. We encourage the longevity of student involvement with our center in similar ways that the University encourages retention at Humboldt State. We like to think of this center as an agent of retention.
