Current Use, Square Footage, & Capacity

Library 109's 987 SF is part of the Library Administration office, with connecting offices; George Wrenn and Keelye Wilson. It is currently an alternative instruction classroom for Library 121, which due to construction, is not usable as a classroom.

Proposed Use, Square Footage, & Capacity

As an alternative request to the proposed Dean's Open Office (if denied by the USFAC), I wanted to suggest an option with a few key possibilities that would be wonderful to explore for Library 109, including some combinations of the following:

- a. Entrepreneurship & Innovation Hub. Having worked with students on projects with startup potential, a location for startup projects, Library Scholar Internship Projects, including Citing Insights Team (software development projects) would be ideal, and a collaborative space for partners; Entrepreneurship club, Hackathon, Startup Business Weekend, SBDC, Arcata Chamber of Commerce and others. Increasingly, public and academic libraries are becoming entrepreneurship or innovation centers; and recently, I submitted two preliminary federal grants to support entrepreneurship, (one attached with this space proposal) and we will see if we are invited to provide a full submission.
- b. Photo Studio: Since we check out camera to students, we often get requests from students for a photo studio. The Art Photo Studio, located in the basement of the library, is restricted to students in specific Art classes. So, perhaps a section of 109 space in the Entrepreneurship & Innovation Hub could serve as flexible space: a conference area, making and photo studio, allowing many uses, e.g. enabling portfolios of entrepreneurs/interns and their projects, or meeting spaces to develop and share ideas.
- c. Other potential uses; 24/7 study space (would require new external doors, camera, etc.

Request Importance - Needs Analysis:

In support of preparing students to be socially and environmentally responsible leaders, and the University's partnership with local communities, the Entrepreneurship & Innovation Hub can serve as cost-effective way to expand resources to students, faculty, staff, and community to engage students in opportunities to transform their world. The library's current Library Scholar Project room will soon become a librarian office, so we will need a space to facilitate the many internships and student projects we manage on an ongoing basis. Now that the SBDC is located in Eureka, this space can also serve as a bridge; I have seen many student projects with commercial potential abandoned because the hurdle to creating a business is significant; we would like to reduce barrier.
