Goal 1 Details:

Project Rebound has been supported by the CSU and is working to improve the lives of formerly incarcerated students as they transition back into the community. Students coming out of the program are obtaining their AA through programs like Pelican Bay CR Model and other clubs found at community colleges. These students are working hard to successfully take advantage of their second chance and become responsible leaders within our community.

Goal 2 Details:

Recently, the student team on-campus has created a week-long set of workshops working to broaden the view of our local community of issues related to the reintegration of formerly incarcerated students into the college environment. Project Rebound focuses on getting their students fully engaged across the campus while assisting them as they transition and struggle through that change.

Goal 3 Details:

Once Project Rebound is fully funded, the program will immediately be collaborating with College of the Redwoods through their Pelican Bay AA Degree Program. The President is aware of the program and has met with the group of students and Admissions. Also, CEEGE is also looking to partner with Admissions to obtain new ways to build avenues for incarcerated students to obtain a BA online and other programmatic designs to help formerly incarcerated students.

Collective Impact:

Supporting the Project Rebound program means another avenue for Enrollment Growth as community colleges, like Santa Rosa JC, have thriving clubs of 200+ of

formerly incarcerated students. The project also seeks to support students well being as they successfully face the challenges of being at a four-year institution. This space allocation also provides another mentoring space that will allow other campus programs to relieve some of the pressures from other retention programs.

Request Importance - Needs Analysis:

The Director of Admissions is currently the assigned Private Investigator on the grant request and believes the growth in support provides an immediate need. In addition, the grant is more likely to be supported once space is identified to support the Project Rebound students. Not having a space in place put the grant at risk of not being funded.

Space is monitored by the grant and would be focused on assisting Project Rebound student to apply and attend HSU. Once the student has arrived the focus switches to help the student retain to eventually obtain a degree from HSU. Every student participating in the program is monitored throughout the entire process from the prospective student stage to the Alumni stage.

Assessment Plan

Assessment Plan:

Admissions look to continue to support the office over the next 5+ years and assure the program continues to develop the model. We hope to outgrow the space but hope to assist the University in obtain funding to build new facilities as new opportunities arise. If support is not provided to Project Rebound the University will lose out on funding to grow enrollment in this space and will put us behind other CSU already making strides in this space. Currently, we are viewed as on the verge of getting ahead of the curve with this enrollment population, but lack of support in terms of space will put us back potentially 2 to 3 years from the rest of the CSU's. The support being offered by campus partners at HSU has put us in a position to take lead across the state in Project Rebound matters and will make us the new benchmark for the CSU's to achieve in terms of student services, program model, and outreach efforts.
