Space Allocation Details

Type of Space Needed

The Egyptology department has a laboratory space in the Old Funky Building named The Egypt Lab. The Old Funky Building is scheduled to be renovated. The Egyptology department needs a temporary laboratory space for The Egypt Lab while the Old Funky Building is renovated into the Wonderful ADA Compliant Building. The temporary space will be used for longer than six months so isn't categorized as temporary. The Egyptology Department requires an instructional space comparable to the Egypt Lab in the Old Funky Building. We have identified GH 114 as a possible alternate space. Room modifications to the alternate space are expected to be minor, if any. We are also open to another space on campus as identified by the USFAC if it meets our space needs.

Request Importance - Needs Analysis:

We must offer the courses that have been historically scheduled in The Egypt Lab, and this request identifies an alternative that will not impact our ability to deliver these courses to our students. In addition, this choice will not impact other programs by requesting other programs to share their space and course schedules with Egyptology. The Egypt Lab is well used by the Egyptology department. In the Spring of 2020, 20 different class meetings were held in the space, representing 15 hours of lecture and 24 hours of laboratory meetings. It would be difficult to fit this many class and laboratory meetings into another department's laboratory space. Attached is a summary of the use of the space for the last three years that shows a similar pattern. In addition, the Egyptology curriculum is very dense and rigid. Students take three to five Egyptology classes a semester. Students must take classes in a particular order and classes must be offered at particular times to avoid conflicts so that Egyptology students can make good progress through the curriculum.
