Continuing Student Retention & Registration Campaign

As of May 18, 2020, 78% of eligible undergraduates have self-registered for Fall 2020. 84.5% of eligible students have no holds on their account. Of note, within a group of 769 students who were enrolled in Spring 2020 but not yet registered for Fall 2020, there is an opportunity group of 291 students who are in good academic standing and who have no holds or barriers to register. Within this population 31 are Freshmen, 60 are sophomores, 91 are Juniors, and 109 are Seniors. We will make direct outreach to these students. Whereas registration was not tracked in the past the way that we began monitoring registration trends last fall, we do not have prior-year trend data for comparison. The tables below summarize Fall 2020 registration in various categories:

Fall 2020 Admissions

We are currently +1.55% (n=1830) ahead last year's number of confirmed students (n=1802). Last week we were +1.07% (n=1791) ahead of last year's number of confirmed students and two weeks ago we experienced a -.97% decline in new student enrollment as compared to the prior year. While this week's trend remains positive but relatively flat, please note that we continue to melt from the 57.44% increase in confirmations as of early March. Our concentration is on student yield. Our Fall 2020 admission trends to-date are as follows:

Financial Aid Packaging

Financial Aid packaging aid for 2020-21 continues on a weekly basis as FAFSAs reach our system and verifications are completed. Accordingly, here is a summary of awards and packaging as of May 18, 2020:

- 7,764 students packaged, including
- 3,292 prospective first-time freshman and
- 1,284 prospective incoming transfers
- 211 incoming local freshmen were packaged with the Humboldt First scholarship

At this point last year, 11,843 students had been packaged. The lower number this year is partly due to lower number of applications, but also significantly slower processing time of verifications while working at home.

Additionally, the last two weeks of staff time has been fairly consumed with awarding Student Adversity Funds to students in desperate need of help. As of Monday morning (5/18), 177 requests had been processed since April 14, and over \$104,629 in emergency grants had been awarded, with amounts ranging from \$60 to \$2000. Most grants were \$500.

Distribution of CARES Fund Dollars

Under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, the University received \$5,151,499 to go directly to students. To date we have allocated emergency funds to 5,200 HSU students who filed a 2019-20 FAFSA and who are eligible for Federal Financial Aid. Students who did not file a FAFSA and are otherwise eligible for financial aid are eligible to receive CARES funding, as well. These students must verify their general eligibility for federal aid by submitting a CARES application, which is available on the Financial Aid Office website, no later than June 15. Requests will take one to two weeks to process. International and undocumented students, who are not eligible for the CARES grant, were awarded and disbursed grants through other types of funds early this week.

We continue to experience an overall decline (-12.65) in the number of students who have confirmed housing assignments. While positive trends continue among returning students (+4.41%), the decline in new student confirmations (-23.28%) have cannibalized our gains. Since the announcement about instruction in Fall 2020 last week, we have experienced a modest uptick in Housing apps (+19) and have not experienced an overwhelming exodus of students who have committed to housing.
